Shormishtha Panja is Professor of English, University of Delhi and Joint Director, Institute of Lifelong Learning, University of Delhi. She received her PhD from Brown University, where she was awarded the Jean Starr Untermeyer Fellowship, and has taught at Stanford University. At Stanford, she was one of the first Indian nationals to be hired by the English Department. She has published widely in national and international journals and collections such as English Literary Renaissance and Shakespeare Yearbook in the areas of her specialization: Renaissance studies, Shakespeare in India, gender studies and visual culture. Her books include (co-edited) Word, Image, Text: Studies in Literary and Visual Culture (Orient BlackSwan, 2009) and Signifying the Self: Women and Literature (Macmillan, 2004, rpt. 2007). She has been invited to lecture at universities in Australia, Canada, the UK and the USA. At Delhi University, she has served as Head, Dept. of English, and Dean, Faculty of Arts, and has served as Chairperson, UUCC, Arts Faculty (Redressal of Sexual Harassment). She has coordinated the project of producing English Literature e-lessons and video lectures at the Institute of Lifelong Learning, University of Delhi. She is the founder member of PEHEL: Delhi University Women's Support Group and the President of the Shakespeare Society of India. She is the author of a blog, Delhi Musings, on CNN IBN
